My Twin Left Me Here ALONE

On 9-11-2025, I went into my twin brother's room to wake him up like I normally do however; he did not move when I called his name. I thought he was ignoring me like he often does until I walked up on him and noticed my brother completed his life at age 24! I screamed at the top of my lungs, my other half left me and my world was shattered. My twin brother Deshon and I shared a bond that was unbreakable and unique. We felt what each other was feeling and we thought alike.

We grew up without a father and we had our fair share of troubles. Depression was no stranger to our family and therapy was not an option because of the stigmatisms. Growing up as a teen I was faced with a very dark situation that changed my life forever. I did not know how to deal with the situation, it was too much for my teenage mind to cope with at the time. I tried to complete my life at the age of 13 and my twin brother Deshon found me, which saved my life. Peer pressure and social media put an ugly mark on my character and it hurt my family. For a while it drove a wedge between my twin brother and myself. He could not understand why I did what I did.

When thinking back we both did not know how to deal with problems or conflict. I guess we thought by eliminating our presence would be the best thing to do. When I was 14 I attempted to complete my life again but this time my mother learned of my intentions.

At this point, interventions entered our lives and I was advised as to go to therapy for in-patient and out-patient services. As the years rolled by I noticed my brother would stay in his room a lot. This continued into our adult years. My brother worked with individuals who had mental illness. Deshon was pyscially assaulted at work twice during the end of last year and I saw a change in him. His isolation became worse. He was involved in a car accident two weeks before he completed his life and he text me saying "I am so upset, I want to kill myself". I spoke with him until he calmed down and I put him in contact with our Godfather. I thought and truly believed my twin would be okay.

I now know my purpose in life. I am going to start a nonprofit to help those suffering from mental illness. My HOPE is to educate family members and friends on warning signs to prevent anyone else from ending their life.

- Please know and act on unsual signs you witness when you are with your family members or friends.
- Patterns exist, do not let them go unaddressed.
- YOU talk to the person even if they do not talk back to you.
- Males need positive role models in their lives that they can confide in and trust.
- Family time is important. Families need to set aside time to speak with each other and spend quality time with each other **WITHOUT** mobile devises.
